



Reading John for Dear Life

Robert Capa was a famous photojournalist who covered five wars and was the co-founder of Magnum, the legendary agency for freelance photographers. His pictures taken at Omaha Beach on D-Day during WWII appeared in Life Magazine and quickly became American icons. Arguably the greatest combat

photographer in history, Capa's maxim was that if your picture wasn't good enough, it meant that you weren't close enough. He constantly strove through his images to take his viewers with him into the middle of the action and risked his life many times over to bring back those compelling shots.

You Bridged the Gap!

Many thanks to all who contributed to our **Mind the Gap** offering in February. We are excited to announce that because the response was so generous, we were able to entirely erase our 2016 deficit (\$31, 835) which puts us in a much stronger financial position at the start of 2017. Since we had already been carrying an accumulated debt position of around \$40,000 prior to the 2016 deficit (several years of small operating budget debt that accumulated during the capital campaign) this greatly improves our overall financial health. To date, 129 contributors have given a total of \$32,437 and gifts came in all sizes – from \$7 to \$1200 and everything in between! Thank you, thank you, thank you!!

Beal Family Thanks You



Reading John for Dear Life (Continued from Cover)

I was reading about him the other day in a new photography book I had just gotten and thought about how his approach to his craft might have something to teach us about Lent. Beginning with Ash Wednesday, when we are called to come face-to-face with our own mortality (“From dust you have come, to dust you shall return”), through the drama of Holy Week (last words, betrayal & crucifixion) and onto the joy of Easter (the surprise of resurrection), this is a season that brings us to the edges of life and death. Though it’s tempting to remain safely on the sidelines, Lent invites us to place ourselves within the Jesus story and get ourselves close to the action.

Over the next 6 weeks in worship and in small groups, we will be Reading John for Dear Life and getting an up-close and behind-the-scenes look at Jesus through the eyes of the writer of this gospel. Among the four portraits of Jesus that we have in the New Testament, John’s is the most unique and

in many ways the most intimate. There are intense encounters with extended dialogs – Nicodemus, the healing at the pool of Bethesda, the story of the woman at the well, the raising of Lazarus – that are intended to draw us in so that we can encounter Jesus firsthand.

I encourage you to find ways that allow you to deepen your faith and find your life renewed in Christ this Lent. Sign up for one of our small groups. Set aside time each day to reflect and pray. Or check out our new Hubworthy page on the website, so you can discover a good book to read. And if you find that your Lent isn’t good enough, in the words of Capa, perhaps you aren’t close enough.

Thank You for Blessing Sierra Leone

Dear Severna Park UMC Family,

Thank you so much for so warmly welcoming Rev. Jane Lahai into our Church and for giving her the opportunity to share her message and love for our heavenly Father. From seeing her name on the church marquis to speaking one-on-one with some of you, Jane was over the moon with joy during her day with us.

Words cannot express our gratitude and appreciation for your generosity. I've never known Jane to be at a loss for words but she was speechless when I told her the Church had raised around \$7,000 to support the work of her school and church in Sierra Leone. To say we were touched is an understatement and I wish I could find the right words to explain what this means to us and the people of Moyamba. After consultation with her District Superintendant and Bishop - and with the blessing of our Missions Committee - your generous gift will be used in the following ways:

\$1,000 will go to help cover stipends of the volunteer teachers that have gone unpaid for the past 4-7 years. Because of your kindness, these hard working teachers will be closer to earning a livable wage this year.

\$2,000 will go towards urgent structural needs in the primary school's boarding home. The second story floors in the boarding home have become so weak that a child fell through and are no longer safe. The window screens are old and

torn allowing mosquitoes to slip through at night. New screens will keep the mosquitoes out and help reduce malaria.

\$4,000 will go towards Trinity United Methodist Church to support the pastoral staff and their efforts to reach out to neighboring villages. In addition to addressing urgent structural needs and making progress on a parsonage, the Church plans to purchase a bicycle for the pastors to use when traveling and perhaps even a projector for worship services. This gift will keep on giving over the years through the pastors' work to continue to share God's love with their own congregation and those in surrounding villages.

As Jane works to implement these funds, we will get plenty of pictures and updates from our new church family in Moyamba. I look forward to sharing these pictures with you as they come in. Thank you so much for your kindness.
