





Truth In Fiction

I like to think that I have an appropriate obsession with this series of books, tales of courage and self-sacrifice in a world that has always captured my imagination. But when it comes down to it, the truth is this: life is stressful. And in times of stress, one way we all cope is by escaping into pop culture. For me, it's Harry Potter. Perhaps for you it's a film series like Star Wars or Indiana Jones, a hit show like NCIS or Friends, or a reality-TV binge-watch like the Bachelorette.

Why do we do this? What is it about a good story that brings us comfort? Sometimes, I'll admit, it feels good to escape daily stressors by entering into another world. It's like taking a vacation from your life, even if it's just for the 20 minutes when you're caught up in a good book. But I suspect, as one of my favorite podcasts says, that "reading fiction doesn't just help us escape from the world, it helps us live in it."

This month, we are exploring the parables of Jesus: fictional stories told by Jesus to those who followed him. It's a bit odd, in a way, to think of these stories as fiction. But it's true. After all, the "good Samaritan" wasn't an actual human being Jesus saw one time in real life, and neither was the "prodigal son."

But these stories are more than good fiction for us who follow Jesus. And these stories do more than simply help us escape our lives. These stories, made-up though they may be, are actually stories that point us back toward our real lives more clearly than any other.

See, fiction isn't all falsehoods. What Jesus knew – and what we can recognize – is that sometimes, we need a bit of fiction in order to see the truth. Like King David in 2 Samuel 12, we are sometimes so caught up in our own stuff that we aren't ready to respond to a direct call from God. Instead, we need someone like the prophet Nathan to tell us the right story in the right moment, to wake us up and change our whole perspective.

And luckily for us, Jesus loved to tell the right story at the right moment.

We all have daily struggles, pitfalls and roadblocks that keep us from the way of Jesus. And there's no denying that in the stress and struggle of life, it's tempting to escape into fiction. But if we are able to turn toward the stories of Jesus, we will be awakened once again to what God is doing in this world.

This month, may the parables of Jesus wake you up. May these stories surprise you afresh, jolting you into the realization of what God needs you to be and do. May you find that in reading fiction by Jesus, you are equipped not to escape the world, but to live in it with more compassion, wisdom, and fierce love each day.

The SPUMC Finance Committee, headed by Christine Chandler, consists of seventeen members including Rev. Ron, Rev. Carissa, and representatives from the congregation. They work diligently to make sure the generous tithes and offerings are

properly protected, managed, and spent. With an annual budget of approximately \$1.4 million, there is much to be done!

Each year in November and December the upcoming year's budget (based on requests from the various church committees and departments) is prepared for submission to the Church Council for approval. During this process, the needs and goals of the church for the upcoming year and future are reviewed and discussed to make sure the church's funds are utilized properly. Accordingly, the annual Stewardship Campaign conducted in the fall before the budget making process begins is an important time for SPUMC, as it provides the Committee with a projection of the revenue to expect in the new year.

The Finance Committee has already started planning for this year's Campaign and is developing ideas to make pledging and giving as easy, exciting, and inspirational as ever before. With the ongoing generosity of SPUMC's members, our church will continue to flourish and be a beacon in our community for Christ.



A Way Forward for the UMC

At their recent meeting, the UMC Council of Bishops received the report of the Commission on a Way Forward (created to help the church find a way through our differences around full inclusion of LGBTQ persons in the UMC) and have recommended the “One Church” model to the 2019 General Conference. You can read BWC Bishop Easterling’s letter explaining this and discover other interpretive resources on our website. severnaparkumc.org/a-way-forward

We have scheduled information forums for **June 10** and **17** in the Parlor with our pastors. They will be on hand to help describe some of the tensions in the UMC around issues of LGBTQ inclusion and also an outline of the process leading up to the 2019 General Conference. Feel free to come to whatever session works for you; they will all include the same information.
