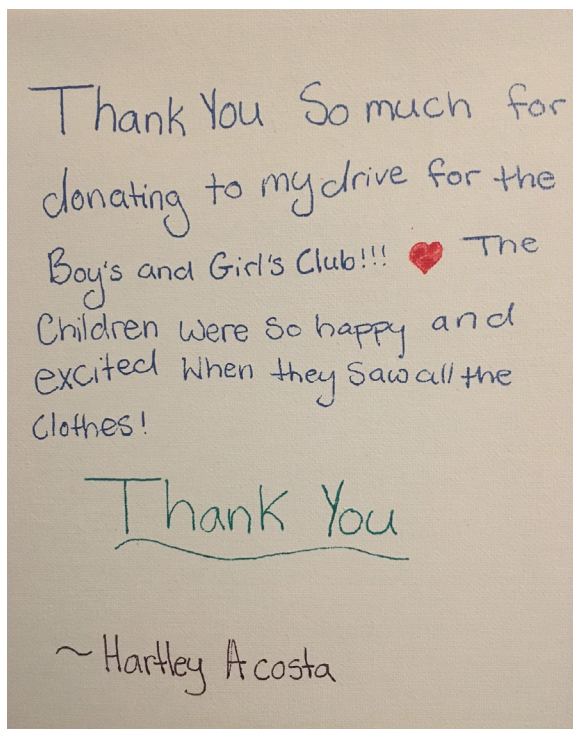

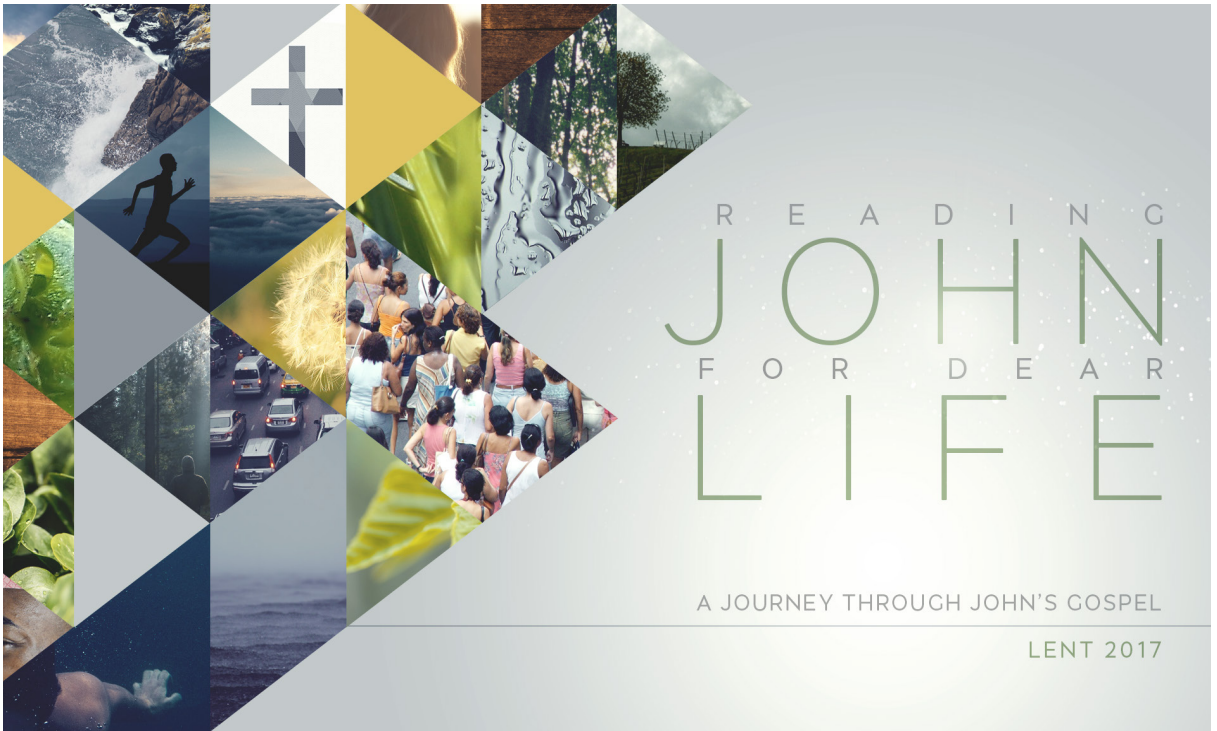
Super Sixth News

People would say similar things each year: Easter means time with family, celebrations, a new dress for church. One kid would always say it meant bunnies and baskets, and a seasoned saint would wisely say that Easter means the promise of new life.

What does Easter mean to you? I've been pondering this question as we have been "Reading John for Dear Life" this Lent. This Easter, I am drawn once more to the beautiful story John weaves, a story of creation and new creation.

Remember how the Bible starts? In the beginning of Genesis, Adam and Eve experienced the love of a personal God, a God who formed them from the dust of the ground and delighted in walking with them in the garden of Eden. It was heaven, you could say, to share such precious, embodied, abundant life with their creator—heaven that was lost in one moment of disobedience that sent God's people wandering in the wilderness for generations.

But the story doesn't stop there: for this Holy Week and Easter, we will have the chance to walk in the garden with God once more. As Jesus is arrested in the Garden of Gethsemane, we'll wonder how our sin led to this moment of brokenness. As Joseph and Nicodemus bury Jesus in a garden, we'll wonder how life can go on after such a loss. And on Easter morning, as we kneel at the tomb with Mary we will meet the risen Christ in a garden. As in the beginning, we will walk in the garden with God, the same one who formed us and knows us by name.

For many of us, Easter still means time with family, special celebrations, bunnies and baskets. But this year, my prayer is that you will find yourself swept up in the story of creation and new creation. God is doing a new thing, right here, right now. Let's look for the risen Christ in the gardens of our life, and join him in the walk.
