and on both banks, I explained to them that we were, in fact, on holy ground not all that different from the muddy waters of the Jordan River. We were about to baptize Steve Collier, one of our beloved adult leaders, and everyone burst into cheers and clapping.

Rev. Carissa read from Colossians 3 about "putting on love" as a new creation in Christ, Rev. Lee offered a heart-felt, tear-laced prayer of blessing, and Steve and I waded into the ankle-deep water. I asked him if he was willing to commit himself to love unconditionally. to serve others humbly and to follow in the way of Christ as faithfully as he could. In each case he responded with a smiling and determined, "Yes I will!" As he leaned forward. I scooped up handfuls of that holv water and doused his head in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

But we weren't done yet; the best was still to come. I invited anyone who desired to join us in the creek. A gaggle of youth and adults bounded down the banks and we circled Steve in

a human ring of love. We sang "Lord, prepare me to be a sanctuary, pure and holy, tried and true, with thanksgiving, I want to be a living sanctuary for you." And we all meant it, perhaps like never before. Then one by one everyone expressed their thanks for Steve's compassionate witness and prayed blessings as we laid hands on him. We topped off the night with a baptism celebration of Frosties and fries (and cell service!) at Wendy's in the little town of Chapmanville. That was nice, but it paled in comparison to the taste of grace we had already been given on Little Harts Creek.

My guess is that Steve's baptism was the highlight of the week for many-it was for me. But truth be told, there was grace flowing generously in the cricks and hollers all week long, in the dignity and warmth of the homeowners, in the sweat and the labor of our youth, in the deep love that was being lived and shared all around. Hope you'll be with us on August 13 for ASP Sunday and you'll hear more about the amazing flow of grace in Lincoln County.
