I never grow tired of learning new things about the Bible. It was about a dozen years ago that I was part of a conference at Princeton Seminary when I heard a mesmerizing presentation from the curator of an art exhibit that was touring the country. He described for us the story of the St.

Financial Snapshot

Through the end of July, we find ourselves in fairly good shape financially. While our general fund giving is down slightly (\$758K in 2016 v. \$730K in 2017), our expenses are down even more (\$809K v. \$695K) due to the fact that we retired our mortgage on the church building last year. This has resulted in a current year small surplus position of around \$35K. We expect that with normal summer patterns, we will fall back a little bit in August but begin to pick back up in revenue in September. Thanks for your continued faithfulness that makes all of our ministries possible.

Continuing the Conversation

The saddening, eye-opening events of Charlottesville have come and gone, but core issues around race, hatred, and prejudice still remain. We had a powerful time of conversation and prayer on August 20 and hope it was just a start. became the Art Director for this ambitious multi-year project that was completed on September 15, 2011.

The result was nothing short of stunning: a seven volume illuminated scripture hand-crafted on vellum, created by artists and biblical scholars. The Smithsonian described it as "one of the extraordinary undertakings of our time" and Newsweek dubbed it "America's Book of Kells." There are 160 larger panel illustrations of texts (my favorite is the creation story) and embellishments throughout, making it a delight to read.

We are going to be using this "Picture" Book Bible for Grown-ups" as a frame and backdrop for a worship series this September, I'll teach a class on the St. John's Bible on Wednesday nights and we'll have one or two Sunday opportunities to see videos about this remarkable work during the Coffee Break. Mostly, it will be a touchstone throughout a six-week journey that will help us get a "Big Picture" of the Bible and explore some of its foundational themes. We'll have links on our website to learn more about this particular Bible, but the hope is that we will all be drawn more deeply into the living Word of God that continues to speak across the centuries to us in our time. too.

Hope you'll make plans to join us on this artful biblical journey!

Snapshot Surveys

Thanks to everyone who took the time to fill out 1,2, 3, or all of our "This Is Us" surveys during the month of August. We hope you had some fun with them and we've also learned some interesting things about our congregation as a result of your input. For example:

- Next to United Methodist, the most common religious background among us is Roman Catholic followed by Baptist
- We prefer to go to the beach v. the mountains by a 5:1 margin
- The average age for worshipers at 8am & 11am is almost identical (67/68) and at 9:30am the average is 47
- Garry's Grill topped the list of go-to places to eat. Adam's Ribs was a pretty close second, and it was Chick-fil-A's pleasure to finish third:)
- Country music topped the charts, and we like Rock and Christian, too
- We love dogs over cats by a 4:1 ratio
- Of the 140 people who responded, 53 ranked their level of connection to our church as 9 or 10 and the overall average was 7.9.
- Our favorite congregational hymn is "Amazing Grace" followed closely by "In the Garden," "How Great Thou Art" and "Here I Am, Lord."
