But her mother, Miriam, persisted in her wild scheme and Hanna began to understand why. Her husband and Hanna's dad, Eli, had died suddenly a year before and Miriam had gotten stuck in her grief. She couldn't eat, couldn't bring herself to go to the favorite places she and Eli had gone to over the 51 years of marriage. She felt guilty that she was living life while he no longer could.

Then one day a switch flipped in her heart. She began to imagine how things would be had she died and Eli lived. "I reversed the feeling," she said. "Would I like him to enjoy life, to continue doing whatever he continued to do with the grandkids, to continue with friendships, to continue? And the answer was immediate, on the spot, a hundred percent yes."

The story ends with them up in the plane, her mother wanting just one more connection with her husband, a mid-air renewal of vows of sorts... a symbolic releasing of her to the next chapter of her life. She sat by the plane's door, mouthing over and over, "I love you, Eli, I'll be doing it for you. I feel you. I really do." And then she jumped and she didn't look back.

Miriam Rosin's story is an Easter story, a story of claiming new life in the face of death. Just like the women at the tomb and then the disciples in the midst of their grief are offered a reconnection with Jesus that transcends time and space, so, too, are we. The good news is: "He is not here. He is risen!" So now what?

Our new worship series, **So Now What: Easter Aftershocks** will help us explore this question, the ripple effects of resurrection. We invite you to this continuing celebration of Easter and what it means to be people who serve and follow a living Jesus. Hope you are willing to jump in with us!

Holy Land & Passion Play

Rev. Ron & Holly are hoping to host a pilgrimage to Israel and Oberammergau in June of 2020 to explore the Holy Land and to see the famous Passion Play that happens every 10 years in this small community in Germany. In Israel, the itinerary will include the Sea of Galilee, Nazareth, Megiddo, Jerusalem, the Dead Sea, and Jericho. Then we'll fly to Munich and transfer to Alpine Village where we will visit castles, churches, and other sites of interest. The next stop is Salzburg where we'll spend a day before taking in the Passion Play in Oberammergau. We'll travel to Innsbruck, Austria and then return to the US. The cost per participant is \$4598 which includes airfare from New York.

We'll be traveling with Educational Opportunities, a group that regularly arranges travel for churches and religious groups (I think they are #1 among United Methodist Churches). We led a group and traveled to the Holy Land in 2013 with them and they were great to work with. There will be an introductory information meeting on Sunday, April 29 at 10:30 & 12noon in the Parlor for anyone who is interested. You can also contact Rev. We appreciate how busy everyone is, but many of you have asked what you can do to help make our garage sale process run more smoothly. We've given this a lot of thought and have come up with the following *suggestions* on how you can help us.

 When possible, separate and label boxes and bags. All *Holiday Items* in a box or bag marked "Holiday" Group *Housewares* together (kitchen items, bath, office, decorative items) Separate and mark bags of *Clothing* (men's, women's, children's) Group **Books**, DVDs, tapes, CDs, records together in the same box

2. Clothing

If possible, bring clothes on hangers. Wire is best.

3. Electrical Items

If an electrical item works, mark it with tape and say, "**It Works**" Use tape to secure remote controls, instructions, and other parts to the item Please send **clean appliances**, especially inside microwaves and toasters Empty vacuum cleaners or remove full bags

4. Computers

Identify whether it works or not Secure supporting books and disks to the computer Secure all other parts (mouse, cable, and keyboards)

5. Collectibles and Treasures

We have a special place on the stage for our treasures, so please identify higher-value collectibles to make sure we do not miss them.

6. Linens

If possible, mark **sheets and bedcovers** with sizes (King, Queen, Full, Twin) Please mark **rug sizes** (2x4, 8x10)
