A Kidney-Shaped Kingdom Glimpse

It was 6:15am on a Friday morning a few weeks back that I found myself in the pre-op area at the University of Maryland Hospital up in Baltimore. I had come to pray with Corey Houghton, a young man from our church in his 40's, who was awaiting kidney transplant surgery. At his bedside was his wife, Annie, who,

with Corey, has been traveling this multi-year road of failing kidney function, tests and more tests, endless doctor's visits, hope and fear.

After checking in to see how Corey and Annie were feeling, I was soon introduced to John who was lying in a bed just on the other side of the room.





John is Annie's sister-in-law's nephew, who had stepped forward when the call went out among family and friends to see if there might be a compatible donor. John's markers matched Corey's and he told me he was there being prepped for his own surgery ready to donate his kidney because "it just seemed like the right thing to do."

It didn't take long for the room to come to life with a steady stream of people in and out, offering instructions and expectations for the surgery, consent papers to be signed with each new visit; doctors, OR nurses, anesthesiologists, technicians. There were three teams in all. One would be working with John to remove his kidney and two would have Corey as their shared patient, the first team removing both of his cyst-covered enlarged kidneys (he shared pictures with me if you're not faint at heart) and the second team that would be implanting John's healthy kidney. The second surgeon shared that he was on his way to Philadelphia for a college visit with his son later that afternoon so that pretty much assured things would stay on schedule.

Before they led Corey and John away, I prayed with them, and Annie, John's parents and one of the nurses joined in our circle of grace. As I made my way back to my car and down I-97 to church, I kept pondering with amazement the years of training, dedication and skill that would be in those operating rooms, the level of coordination it takes to make a transplant successful, the delicate and intricate

integration of all these moving parts. I had witnessed a glimpse of God's kingdom in these multi-ethnic, multi-generational teams of medical personnel, hope-filled and anxious families and patients all working and praying toward a common goal of healing and new life.

I am happy to report that both John and Corey came through their surgeries well. Just earlier this morning, I spoke with Corey and he continues to progress, a little stronger and more himself with each passing day.

As I write this, I am on break from joining in all the frenzied preparations going on for another Missions Garage Sale at our church. In its own way (albeit less dramatically) it, too, is a sign of the Kingdom: so many dedicated and gifted people coming together to do tasks big and small all for the larger purpose of raising thousands of dollars for missions. All so that lives can be healed and God's salvation offered. Better get to work and see where my gifts are most needed. How about you?

So... What Is Annual Conference?

This time of year, you'll hear church leaders talk about something called "annual conference." Here's what it all means.

In the United Methodist Church, the term "annual conference" can mean three things. An annual conference is, first, a **regional body** of the church. In the United States, the UMC is organized into 56 different annual conferences. We are part of the Baltimore-Washington Annual Conference, a region that covers Washington DC, most of Maryland, plus two counties in West Virginia. When the bishop appoints clergy to serve in different churches, those pastors generally stay within the boundaries of the conference.

Sometimes, you'll hear us talk about a decision that the annual conference has made. When we're doing this, we're referring to the **organizational body** of the church – that is, the central office, staff, and volunteers that conduct the work of the annual conference. Clergy and lay persons serve as volunteers on conference boards, commissions, and committees, such as when Rev. Ron and Rev. Lee serve on the Board of Ordained Ministries. This aspect of the annual conference keeps us connected and supported in our local church ministry!

Finally, this time of year, we use the term "annual conference" to refer to the **annual business meeting** held each year at the end of May/beginning of June. All the clergy in the annual conference region gather together with an equal number

of lay members, and together do the work of the church. These sessions will include reports of past and ongoing work; adoption of future goals, programs and budgets; ordination of clergy members as deacons and elders; and election of delegates to Jurisdictional and General Conferences. This year, the Baltimore-Washington Annual Conference Session will take place May 30-June 1 in Baltimore, with the theme, "We are One: Beneath the Cross." You can read more about this year's agenda at bwcumc.org/events/annual-conference

So why does this all matter?

The annual conference matters because we are not alone here at Severna Park UMC. We are part of a connectional church, a network of United Methodists across the state, all within a global structure that is taking the good news around the world. As our church encounters the changing culture, we are part of a larger body of Christ, one body, one Lord, one faith, one baptism.

So this May 30-June 1, we invite you to pray for our annual conference session. Pray for Revs. Ron, Lee, and Carissa, and for our lay members, Erica Benjamin, Heather Kraus, and Beth Smith. Pray for Chris, as he joins a conference team in leading worship. Pray for those conference leaders who are presenting reports of their work to adapt the church to a changing world. Pray for the whole body as we make decisions about what we will value with our time and treasure in the coming year. And pray for the Holy Spirit to be among us, as we gather together in Baltimore, "one beneath the cross."



Praying for a Way Forward

The Council of Bishops has been meeting in Chicago this past week to receive and respond to the final report of the Commission on a Way Forward. The 32-member Commission which represents diverse viewpoints, global and regional contexts and clergy and lay perspectives was created by the 2016 General Conference in hopes of helping the UMC break the impasse we have found ourselves at for decades over issues of human sexuality. Please continue to hold our entire church in prayer as we seek to find loving and faithful ways to share a unified witness in spite of our theological and cultural differences over LGBTO inclusion.

As the Bishops issue their recommendation* that will be taken up at a specially called General Conference of the UMC a year from now, in the coming months we will be offering information sessions, forums for discussion and small group studies to help us understand and explore the issues that are before our denomination. We will post a resource section on our website to provide articles, books and links to help us all stay in the loop on a local level about proposals that potentially could change the shape of our global church.

In April, we celebrated the 50th Anniversary of the formation of the United Methodist Church which involved the coming together of the Evangelical United Brethren Church and the Methodist Church in 1968. What will be the shape and structure of our church moving forward is very much on the table right now and hard to predict. Will we find a way to continue to be United Methodists? I hope and pray so.
