# "A Way Forward" Event with Tom Berlin

The United Methodist Church is at a crossroads as it lives into a season of discernment and choosing. In February, a special session of the General Conference will be held to consider the work of the Commission on a Way Forward and how the denomination will address LGBTQ inclusion. It is a time, some say, for the church to decide if we will walk together loosely or part with a blessing.

On **September 15**, Rev. Tom Berlin, a member of the Commission on a Way Forward, will discuss the different options facing the church from **10am-3pm**, at Nichols-Bethel UMC, 1239 Murray Road in Odenton. #### **Safe Sanctuary Review**

As we continue to pray for our brothers and sisters in the Roman Catholic Church who have suffered from sexual abuse and the accompanying years of silence/ cover-up, we wanted to remind you of the practices we have in place to ensure the safety, well-being, and spiritual growth of the children and youth entrusted to our care. Every person, whether staff or volunteer, who works with our children completes our Safe Sanctuary process. This process consists of an application. references, background check (rechecked every 5 years), and questionnaire (completed annually). Only once volunteers have been vetted through this process may they begin to serve.

While working with children, volunteers are expected to adhere to a code of conduct laid out in our policy to ensure that there are not opportunities for abuse to occur. If allegations of abuse are brought forth (whether they occurred on site or not), the clergy and staff are mandatory reporters. This means that in addition to notifying our professional chain of command, we also notify the proper legal authorities. The well-being of children within our care is of the utmost importance to us. As we affirm every time we baptize a child, we all pledge to "live according to the example of Christ... that they may be true disciples who walk in the way that leads to life." In some ways, they echo for me the even more ancient words of the prophet Micah, who in the sixth chapter rhetorically asks what God desires more: our ceremonial worship or our committed lives? The answer comes in one of the most foundational and memorable verses in scripture. "What does the Lord require of you? But to do justly, to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God." (Micah 6:8)

Those convicting words of the prophet will be our anchor and guide in our next worship series, "Do, Love, Walk" which will begin on September 9 and run for six weeks. We have stunning new Micah 6:8 banners that will hang in the Sanctuary (thanks Carol Rice, Nancy Densmore & Diane McGrath!) as a visual invitation into this text. We'll spend two Sundays each exploring what it means to seek God's justice, to extend compassion to our neighbors and to live with a deep and authentic sense of humility. Each week, we'll offer suggested follow-up readings and two of our fall study options will allow us to explore this theme more deeply.

On Wednesday nights, I'll be teaching a 7-week study on the world-wide refugee crisis called *Welcoming the Stranger* and we'll be talking about how difficult, urgent and polarizing (both inside and outside the church) this issue has become. Additionally, I'm launching a new yearlong monthly *Race & Faith Book Group*. Our first selection is *Just Mercy* by Bryan Stevenson, an inspiring lawyer who has committed his life to challenging bias against the poor and people of color.

Beyond these two groups, we are also offering a wide range of Bible and book studies: Anxious for Nothing (Rev. Lee), A Fresh Look at the Bible (Rev. Byron), Disciple 2 (Dave McKinney), Better Together (a marriage enrichment group with Rev. Carissa and Matthew), Inspired (Young Adult Group) and Heavenly Minded Mom (Moms Connect with Erica). There is more information about these classes and more on pages 6-7. We hope that you will use this season to deepen your own faith journey as we **Do, Love, Walk** together.


