"I thank my God every time I remember you, constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you, because of your sharing in the gospel from the first day until now. I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work among you will bring it to completion by the day of Jesus Christ."

Paul's letter to the Philippians has always been one of my favorite books of the Bible. It's upbeat and encouraging, full of joy and warmth and while it's short, contains some of the best theology in the New Testament. A Safe Place

In the midst of a deeply partisan and rancorous confirmation process for Judge Brett Kavanaugh to the Supreme Court, the issue of sexual assault and trauma has come to the forefront. And it's not only Dr. Christine Blasey Ford who is telling her story. Thousands of other women have been empowered to come forward and tell their stories of being victimized and mistreated, some for the first time.

My intent is not to take sides or to presume either guilt or innocence. I have no doubt that as a congregation we are deeply divided over the issue of who is "telling the truth" with two seemingly credible witnesses offering very different stories of long ago events, whether or not this is justice crying out or a smear campaign designed to derail a qualified judge of character. Countless polls suggest that the way we interpret the events of the last few weeks has been largely influenced by whether we are Republican or Democrat, male or female, younger or older. We are divided as a nation and divided in this church.

But I hope that we can be completely united when it comes to making our church a safe and supportive community

for women (or men) to tell their stories of being sexually assaulted. All of your pastors are available to listen, to pray, to offer sacred space for healing. Please know that your story will be received with care and in confidence. In my recent sermon, Just Mercy, I quoted Bryan Stevenson who said "We are more than the worst thing that we have done" and added my own corollary: "We are (also) more than the worst thing that has ever been done to us." Praying for all of you who are carrying deep wounds.

I can remember going to the Princeton
Library and digging out dusty and seldom
touched (or read!) commentaries as I
prepared to facilitate conversations on
Jesus emptying himself in humility (Phil.
2:5-11), Paul urging the Christians in
Philippi to press on toward the upward
call of Christ (3:14) and all of us being
reminded that we "can do all things
through Christ who strengthens us." (4:13)
I come back to this book time and again in
my own devotional reading.

That's why I'm so excited to announce that our next worship series, Attitude Adjustment, will take us on a 4-week journey through Philippians as together we learn about what it means to be formed with the mind of Christ. That doesn't happen overnight and it requires that God work a major attitude adjustment in each of us. Here are some of the shifts we'll consider:

October 21 - From Spectators to Partners (Phil. 1:3-11)

October 28 - From Burnt Out to Fueled Within (Phil 2:12-16)

November 11 - From Looking Back to Straining Forward (Phil. 3:10-21)

November 18 - From Worry to Joy (Phil. 4:4-9)

Along the way, we'll hear testimonies from SPUMC members who live as partners in the work of Christ, find their energy from God's Spirit at work in their lives and our church, and who have a forward-looking orientation in life.

We'll culminate the series on November 18th with Thanks & Giving Sunday as we renew our commitments through our giving and serving. Are you ready for an attitude adjustment?

Adding Machines Ready?

For SPUMC, this is the season for putting together next year's budget. As you can imagine, with a church our size, there is a lot to take into consideration. It is the Finance Committee's job to formulate a budget over the next three months for ultimate approval by Church Council.

The Finance Committee starts the process by asking the various committees and departments, consisting of Missions, Ministries, and Operations, to submit their budget requests taking into consideration how much they received last year, how they spent what they received, their goals and visions for the upcoming year, and what monies, if applicable, they can expect from fundraisers or outside sources. The various categories are missions, music, education, hospitality, worship, stewardship, pastoral care, staff costs, church building maintenance and capital expenses, apportionments, office expenses and communications.

The Finance Committee will then look at the results of the upcoming Stewardship Campaign (set to commence on October 21st and end on November 18th with Consecration Sunday) to determine a realistic figure of the tithes to be expected by the church for the upcoming year. This is why the pledge cards to be submitted by the congregation are so important. The Finance Committee needs the information in order to prepare the new budget.

With all this information in hand, the Finance Committee creates the new budget, tweaking the budget proposals from the various committees and departments as needed to make it

all add up to tay within the projected revenue. Our current year's budget was approximately \$1.4M.

So, as SPUMC conducts the 2018
Stewardship Campaign, the congregation is asked to keep in mind the importance of the timely submission of pledge cards and that the pledge cards contain information that is as realistic and accurate as possible. The Finance Committee is accounting on it.

With the continuous generosity of SPUMC's members, our church will continue to flourish and be a beacon in our community and, subsequently, God's work, through our church, will thrive.

Endowment Committee Grants

The Permanent Endowment Committee recently agreed to fund \$8,000 in grants for 2019, a \$1,000 increase from 2018, as the SPUMC Endowment Fund continues to grow.

The goal of the Endowment Fund is to conserve principal and use the earnings for purposes above and beyond the church's programs funded by the annual operating budget. The Permanent Endowment Fund began distributing earnings in 2009 and since that time the Fund committee has approved over \$30,000 in grants for non-budget/special projects such as KidCheck and various enhancements to the sanctuary A/V system.
