SPAN Garden Origin

After spending time in prayer, discernment, and outreach the call to start a Community Garden was heard. We spoke with the executive director of SPAN, Maria Denardo to ascertain need. The need is real. Most of the food supplied by SPAN is canned, packaged, and processed food. They receive fresh produce on Mondays from Victoria's Fancy Foods. Whatever they receive is gone the same day.

We reached out to Amazing Grace Lutheran Church in Baltimore. They have maintained community gardens there for years. They have agreed to help guide the project. We reached out to MD Sunrise Farms in Odenton. They have supplied contacts, information, and resources. We met with the folks serving through Service and Outreach at Our Shepherd Lutheran Church. The response was overwhelmingly positive.

At the same time, Peter Jensen a member of the OSLC Youth Group, was looking to complete a service project for his Eagle Scout badge. Turns out, he was looking to do something like a garden!

The plans were formalized. Peter built the Community Garden with direction and permission from the OSLC Property Committee and Church Council. The Service and Outreach Ministry will reach out to the congregation and community to be the hands and feet of the project. Lois Wilson, who is currently serving on Church Council spoke to her husband Fred about the project. Fred has agreed to manage the garden.
