As we move into Holy Week, we will see that Peter continues to play a starring role, even if he doesn't always come off looking so good. It is Peter who resists allowing Jesus to wash his feet; Peter who falls asleep in the garden while Jesus prays; Peter who follows at a safe distance and then denies Jesus three times before the cock crows; Peter who is as broken and lost by the death of Jesus as all of the rest of the disciples.

But betrayal, abandonment and death are not the end of the story for Jesus, for Peter – or for us. And thank God for that.

Cynthia Campbell, President of McCormick Theological Seminary tells the story of the great opera composer Giacomo Puccini who died suddenly before he was able to finish his final work, Turandot. One of his fellow composers, Franco Alfano, wrote two final scenes that completed the work. When the opera premiered at Milan's La Scala opera house in 1926, the famous Arturo Toscanini was the conductor. Toscanini got to the place where Puccini had left off, and dramatically, he stopped the performance, turned to the audience and with tears in his eyes announced, "This is where the master ends." Then after that sacred pause, he raised his baton again and said, "This is where his friends continue," and he went on to conclude the performance.

With Jesus' death and resurrection, the master ends. In the mysterious days of the resurrection appearances including Peter's redemption, new life is stirred until the Spirit comes dramatically at Pentecost

to give birth to the church. This is where his friends continue, and it is Peter, the flawed but faithful disciple, who is leading the charge: preaching to the bewildered crowds that day, interpreting his vision at Joppa as an ever-widening circle of grace, leading the early church to take on the work of spreading the good news.

Come join us for worship this Holy Week, Easter, and beyond as we join our story with Peter's and claim our place as Jesus' friends who continue life beyond death. Easter is the holy hinge that makes it all possible. And for that we say, "Alleluia!"

A Response to 2019 General Conference from the SPUMC Church Council

Since the 2019 General Conference of the United Methodist Church announced new policies which affirm and strengthen prohibitions against full inclusion of LGBTQ+ persons in the life of the church, we have felt and heard the deep hurt experienced by members and friends who hoped the global UMC would remove restrictions on marriage and ordination for LGBTQ+ persons. We have also felt and heard the concerns of those who approve of the decisions made by the global UMC, yet wonder whether they are fully welcome in our local church where others do not share their views. Through some difficult but loving conversations with one another, we are encouraged that the Holy Spirit is guiding us to remember our common identity as people in need of the grace of God, called to do the work of Jesus.

The lay leadership of Severna Park United Methodist Church affirms that in our local church. ALL of God's children are welcome and loved, just as they are. Our church deeply values allowing folks space to be true to themselves as they follow Christ, look to scripture with a heart for God's will and seek the guidance of the Holy Spirit. It is our tradition to love one another when there is disagreement on interpretation of scripture, and to listen to and learn from one another, even when we have different faith convictions. We believe that the true tradition of the United Methodist Church is to draw the circle wide. We strive to offer a big tent under which all can gather and grow on our path to deepen our love for God and one another, to serve God's people and to follow in the way of Jesus. Please know that all are welcome. We need you and love you.
