Better Together

Back in 1967, the Youngbloods released a song that would become their only Billboard Top 40 hit. By the time that “Get Together” peaked at #5 on the charts in 1969 with a second release, it had become part of the American folk/rock canon of that era and people still recognize and sing it today.

In many respects, its message is as current now as it was back then during this period of intense societal

upheaval that included Vietnam War protests, a national reckoning with racial inequalities, the women’s rights movement and a rapidly changing social order. To that world and to ours, these words still ring true:

*If you hear the song I sing
You will understand,
(listen!)
You hold the key to love
and fear*

All in your trembling hand

Just one key unlocks them both

 Come on, people now
 Smile on your brother
 Everybody get together
 Try to love one another right now

We chose the theme for our fall worship series – **Better Together** – because both as a church community and polarized society, there is a desperate need to “get together,” “smile on your brother (and sister)” and unlock love and healing with the “key to love and fear all in our trembling hands.”

On a very basic level as a church, we find ourselves continuing to recover from the multi-year effects of Covid-19 that have altered not just our health but our personal patterns and rhythms. We are rebuilding every area of our ministry from the ground up. Some of us have gotten very comfortable worshipping online at our convenience or we've simply fallen out of the habit of coming to church. I can't tell you how many conversations I've had this summer with SPUMC folks who begin with, “You know, we really need to get back to church...” but who haven't returned yet regularly or at all for many different reasons.

The reality is that we are a better and stronger community when we are with one another face to face in our Sanctuary for worship or in a small group Bible study or serving side by side in missional outreach. When more of us come together - when we simply show up - it adds life and energy for everyone. We don't do it just for ourselves, either; we do it for one another and in the process, we become **Better Together**.

In a deeper and broader sense, we are **Better Together** as we adopt an attitude and posture of openness toward one another. When we seek to stay in relationship across our divides, when we refuse to demonize or write off those who are different from us, when we recognize that we hold the one key that “unlocks them both,” we discover that we no longer have to fear but can genuinely “try to love one another right now.”

We invite you to join us this fall for in-person worship on **Sundays at 8am, 9:15am or 10:45am** (note the time changes) as we learn firsthand that we are indeed, **Better Together**. Of course, we will continue to provide our **online worship** on Sundays via Facebook & YouTube at **10:45am** but we'd much rather see you in person if you can make it here. If you've been away for a while or just “out of the habit” of being in church on Sunday mornings, know you are loved, missed, needed and welcome here. Your presence and participation really do make us **Better Together!**

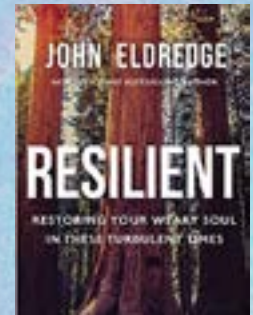

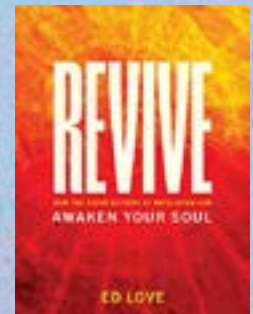

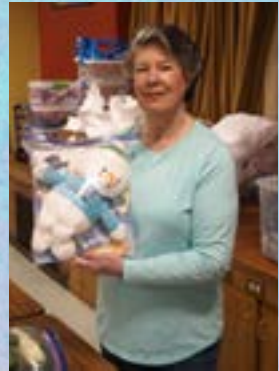

Book and Toy Ministry

The *Book and Toy Ministry* is now in its 10th year. Originally known as simply the *Book Ministry*, it was started as part of Heaven's Kitchen by Trent Muzik. He was in middle school and with the support of his parents, collected reading materials and displayed them for guests of Heaven's Kitchen to take with them. This ministry was very much appreciated by children and adults.

As Trent grew older, he became a member of a traveling sports team which didn't allow him to continue this Ministry. He asked if

someone would like to lead this ministry, and I felt called to volunteer. Now, after seven years, it is now the *Book and Toy Ministry*. I recalled when I was teaching, the students loved to hold a stuffed animal or toy that was related to the story I was reading to them. I decided to collect children's books and match a stuffed animal or toy with each one. I take 20-25 matched children's books to Heaven's Kitchen whenever I can go. I, also, collected books for pre-teens, teens, and adults. Many adults will choose books not only for themselves, but as a gift for a special child. When a child comes to the table to choose a book, I love how they go about making a choice and their smile is priceless.



At Christmas, the children's books and toys are wrapped so the adults can give a wrapped gift to a special child in their life. They are so grateful for this opportunity.

Last September, we collected almost 100 books and toys. Through this month, a 2nd Book and Toy drive is being held. Please bring your donations to Fellowship Hall and place them on the counter. My only requests are that each stuffed animal, toy, and book is in 'like new' condition and can fit into a two-gallon plastic bag. Books are accepted for all ages.

The mission of Dallas International University, as an institution of higher education, is to provide education and research opportunities leading to degrees in applied linguistics, culture studies, and development of languages.

She also teaches a class in Oral Translation which prepares students to translate the Bible in a way which communicates to communities who do not read. In addition, he continues to homeschool their children, Joshua and Michaela, who are in the process of finishing high school.

Better Together Fall Sunday School

This fall Sunday School kicks off on **September 11th!** Throughout the fall we will be focusing on the spiritual habit of spending time with others while studying the Psalms and Prophets. Sunday School will be weekly at 9:15. This year as families arrive and check in, babies and toddlers will proceed to the nursery, preschool children will proceed directly to their classroom, room 114. Elementary children will participate in play stations during arrival and then have music time with our new music director, Laura Young, from 9:15-9:30 before moving to their Sunday School rooms, rooms 116 & 117. There is nursery care weekly at 9:15 for children 2 years and younger and at 10:45 for children 5 and younger. Throughout the fall, middle and high school youth will also focus on the spiritual habit of spending time with others and friendship while studying Hebrews and more. When youth arrive they can go right to their classrooms, rooms 302 & 303.

Sunday School is led by a team of volunteers, mostly parents, but also teachers, grandparents, and members that want to share their love of Jesus with our kids. This year we have teaching opportunities especially in our preschool class and high school class. We are currently in need of one volunteer for preschool kids and volunteers for middle and high school youth. Please let Erica know how you'd be willing to serve this school year. Nursery Care is available weekly at 9:15am for children 2 & younger, and at 10:45am for kids 5 and younger.

Kids are a vital part of our mission work at SPUMC. Throughout the year, preschool-high school youth help pack bags for our Backpack Buddies ministry.

Blessing of the Backpacks

On **Sunday, August 28**, we had a large crowd on hand to witness the blessing of students and teachers as they headed back to school. We had everyone from 3-year olds to high school seniors, pre-school teachers to college faculty come forward to receive a blessing and small reminders of the church's ongoing support for them in the form of stickers, tags and other goodies to place in and on their backpacks.
