State of the Church

Pressing On and Come & See

With the President about to deliver the State of Union Address this coming week (an annual tradition around this time of year), I thought it would be good to do something similar for our congregation. So, on the last Sunday of January, I gave my own “State of the Church” sermon to help us assess where we are on our long road to recovery as a congregation coming through the Covid-19 pandemic.

I began by taking a look back at 2022 and sharing the good news that slowly but surely, we are seeing members and long-time friends return to our church. Our attendance for the last quarter of the year was at about 60% of our pre-pandemic numbers (on the higher side of what churches are experiencing overall) and you can feel the renewed energy on Sunday mornings. We also had 30 new people join our congregation along with 15 Confirmands who became full members.

The new reality, though, is that while people are coming back, they are attending worship less frequently – people’s habits have simply changed – and that’s a pattern that was happening pre-2020 but like so many other things, got accelerated by the Covid disruption. There were many other signs of recovery and life, as well. In 2022 we were able to re-engage with some of our most important outreach ministries that had been put on hold for the previous two years: we sent youth & college students to ASP for the 40th summer, pulled off the huge Fall Missions Garage Sale with the help of long-timers and newcomers, sent out a VIM/ASP team to Tennessee and hosted guests at our church for Winter Relief. Participation in Sunday School, youth group, choir, classes and small groups has also grown. And on Christmas Eve it felt like “the good ol’ days” as we scurried to set up chairs for our overflowing 4pm Family Service where we had over 400 people attend; overall we had 900+ people worship with us on Christmas Eve compared with a little less than 600 in 2021.

On the financial front, you all rallied with your giving in the last two months of the year and we finished with a “surplus” of \$40K (compared with \$1K in 2021). That’s worth celebrating but it’s also important to recall that the prior two year’s “surpluses” were only made possible by the presence of the \$156K PPP grant we had each year (about 11% of our budget) designed to help small businesses and non-profits retain staff (it worked!). In 2023 that will go away so it will take more of us giving (something we are projecting) and all of us giving more (something we are hoping for) to bridge that gap.

As we look to this new year, the key phrases I lifted up for us from the scriptures that morning (Philippians 3:12-17 & John 1:35-46) are Pressing On and Come and See. We have a lot of work left to do to regain our full strength which will require all of us, like long distance runners, to “press on for the prize of the upward call in Christ Jesus” as Paul says. There is so much to celebrate but there is no time to let up! And it will take all of us adopting a posture and creating a culture of Come and See as we intentionally and persistently welcome people back and welcome new people into our congregation. Won’t you join me in this important work?



SPAN is experiencing an increased need for financial donations to assist people in the area who are about to lose their housing because of inability to pay the month's rent. Others can't pay to keep the heat on in their apartment or house. Many have lost their jobs, and others have experienced serious medical issues that have prevented them from working.

The February communion offering will be given to SPAN to assist in its mission of providing emergency assistance to those in our area threatened with immediate loss of housing or heat. SPAN's policy is to help clients financially only once a year, but the need is still great, and is continuing to grow. If you are able, please give generously to support SPAN's mission in church or online. And if you need help personally, SPAN is open **Monday through Thursday from 10:00 to 1:30**.

Current pantry shortages include: tomato products (including sauce, paste, and tomato main dishes like Ravioli) as well as Baked Beans.

Living Well Multiplies Blessings

SPUMC provides game changing donations to organizations that benefit Women and Refugees!

For those of you who have been around SPUMC for a while, you will recall Living Well on Wilkens, a mission initiated by Rev. Nicole Houston back in 2013 and lovingly supported by so many. LWOW involved the renovation and subsequent purchase of a home on Wilkens Avenue in Baltimore which served as a Hospitality Day Center for sex trafficking victims. Unfortunately, for many reasons, this ministry was not sustainable so a decision was made to pivot to working with the International Rescue Commission to house fully vetted refugees in the home. We were weeks away from having guests move in but the timing was not right as US policy shifted and the number of legal refugees entering the US was greatly reduced. In 2020, the Living Well on Wilkens board members made the difficult decision to sell the property, and asked the Mission Committee in 2022 to distribute the proceeds to missions benefitting Women (particularly victims of sexual or domestic exploitation and abuse) and Refugees who are seeking asylum in the US.

A small group from Missions volunteered to spearhead the process for finding organizations where we would have the greatest impact, mostly local (or UMC affiliated internationally), while meeting the requirement to benefit Women or Refugees. A grant application process was designed to give all organizations an equal chance to benefit from the proceeds, while also holding organizations accountable. All Missions Committee and Church Council members were invited to send the application to any qualified organization, and there were at least 20 organizations contacted.

We received 10 applications and after much discussion, prayer and discernment, the proposed awards were recently approved by the Mission Committee and the Church Council. The awards totaling \$45,000 are:

- \$2,500** – The Samaritan Women/Institute for Shelter Care – in Honor of Rev. Nicole (Donation to the Scholarship Fund)
- \$7,500** – ERICA (Episcopal Refugee & Immigrant Center) – provides funds to Afghan refugees for college education partnership with Towson, UMBC, Goucher and Notre Dame of MD
- \$7,000** – Capitol Hill United Methodist Church – shelter and clothing for newly arrived asylum seekers entering Washington, DC in recent months
- \$7,000** – Kenya Connect – a Baltimore based organization that provides education for teenagers in Kenya to prevent sexual exploitation and young marriages, supporting 62 schools
- \$7,000** – Annapolis Immigration Justice Network – works with local lawyers with reduced fees to help asylum seekers pay for legal services resulting in US citizenship
- \$5,000** – Sierra Leone Education Fund – an SPUMC ministry that will provide college funds to 4 recent female high school graduates in Sierra Leone; this ministry is affiliated with the UMC Church.
- \$3,500** – Hope for All provides local shelter services to women and victims of domestic violence
- \$2,500** – YWCA of Annapolis – Helps survivors of sexual violence and domestic abuse
- \$1,000** – LIRS (Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Services) – Job support to MD asylum seekers

\$1,000 – Just Neighbors Ministry – UMC Affiliated ministry providing legal services

\$1,000 – Friendship Beyond Borders – startup organization providing IT equipment in Syria Thanks to the Mission Committee and the subcommittee (*Jennifer Pilholski, Leslie Wexler-Williams, Becky Clapp and Rev. Narae*) for overseeing the grant application process. We are so happy that the proceeds from Living Well on Wilkens will benefit so many deserving missions!
